

College Chaplain's Message

With God's Grace, the date of the arrival of His All-holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew is drawing closer. The Apostolic Visit of history's longest serving Ecumenical Patriarch is a historic moment, a spiritual milestone celebrating the 100th Anniversary since the establishment of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of Australia, and a unique opportunity for all of us to be a part of something that transcends time and borders.

His All-Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew is not only the spiritual leader of the world's Orthodox Christians, but also a beacon of hope, light, peace, and environmental stewardship for all humanity. He is a global figure, a leader who is often referred to as the "Green Patriarch" as a result of his pioneering work in environmental conservation and interfaith dialogue.

His presence in Australia is a rare and precious gift, one that offers us the chance to connect more deeply with our faith, our heritage, and the values that shape us as individuals and as a community.

The visit of the Ecumenical Patriarch is a historic event for the Orthodox Church in Australia and for the broader Australian society. This is only the second time an Ecumenical Patriarch has visited our shores. In fact, the first time was in 1996, when His All-holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew visited Australia. He even visited and blessed our school!

Many events have been organised in order to offer us the opportunity to receive his blessing. These are opportunities that may not be repeated in our lifetimes!

The arrival of His All-Holiness is more than just a ceremonial event; it is a profound spiritual experience which links us directly to our faith and heritage. It is a time for reflection, for renewal, and for deepening our connection with God. In a world that is often fast-paced and filled with distractions, this visit offers a moment of stillness, a chance to reconnect with the core of our beliefs, and an opportunity to receive the blessings of one of the most respected spiritual leaders of our time.

We will be standing in the presence of someone who has dedicated his life to serving God and humanity, one who has protected and maintained the sacred sites of Holy Orthodoxy under challenging circumstances, someone who has walked the halls of power and the corridors of the soul, advocating for peace, justice, and the care of God's creation. This is a chance to be inspired, to listen, to learn, and to grow in your faith.

I encourage each and every one of you, together with your families, to make the most of this opportunity. Attend as many of the events as possible, participate in the Divine Liturgy celebrated by His All-holiness, listen to his words of wisdom, and allow yourself to be moved by the spirit of this extraordinary occasion. This is not just about showing up; it's about being fully present, open-hearted, and ready to receive the blessings and inspiration that this visit will undoubtedly bring.

In years to come, when you look back on your lives, you will remember this visit not just as an event you attended, but as a moment that enriched your spiritual journey and connected you more deeply to your faith and community. You will remember it as a time when you stood with the whole church in welcoming a leader who has touched the lives of millions across the globe.



Year 7 and 8 Technology Report


Year 7 Bin on Wheels
