College Chaplain's Message

With God's Grace we embark on the Ecclesiastical New Year. Like every beginning, this is an opportunity to reflect on the cycle that has passed and prepare ourselves for the year ahead. The Gospel reading (Luke 4:16-22) reveals the fulfilment of the words of the Prophet Isaiah, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord" (Luke 4:18-19).

This revelation ought to be an important companion for us as we embark on the New Ecclesiastical Year. Jesus has come to proclaim the good news. He has come to remind us that He has become human and assumed human nature, and sanctifying human nature through union with the Divinity. He has come to grant healing. He has come to give sight to the blind; and spiritual sight to the spiritually blind. He has come to preach good news to the poor; the good news of salvation that is offered to all who believe, regardless of status and race. He has come to free prisoners. Those imprisoned to the passions and have become slaves to sin can be free through repentance and confession. Those held captive by death are set free through the death of the Saviour!

As we walk with Christ in the year ahead, let us do so in a spirit of faith and hope. Let us remember that Christ has already granted us victory. In all the challenges we face, let us remember that Christ is with us, guiding and supporting us on the way.

For Orthodox Christians, September 1st has a deeper significance because 35 years ago, the Holy Synod of the Ecumenical Patriarchate established this day as a Day of Prayers for the Protection of the Natural Environment. It is a day on which the faithful pray for the natural environment, and that God grants people wisdom to care for the environment.

This most auspicious occasion reminds us of our responsibility and duty, as stewards of creation, to care for God's creation. It reminds us of our obligation to maintain our world, and not abuse it carelessly or selfishly. We are called to ensure that we protect the natural environment for future generations. We are also reminded to look to our loving God through the marvels of His creation.

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




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
